Happy Summer RMCA Parents,

We wanted to send out our summer newsletter to share with you all important dates and events that will be taking place over the summer. What a year it has been. I want to thank you all for the support and well wishes that I and the school have received during this closure.

I have had several questions from the community about what the new school year will look like for RMCA. This is going to change throughout the summer and the RMCA team has been working on many plans for our community. Here is what we know: We know that we are working on having the most normal school year possible. We will have 5day school weeks with normal schedules. We will have the most in person learning allowed by state officials. We will continue to have the cleanest and safest school building in the city. We will have some eLearning options for students if necessary and requested. We know that there will be huge cuts in school funding and that RMCA will be tackling these funding issues head on and will be able to provide the best schooling with the best teachers next year. We will have close to a 90% teacher retention rate for next year, which is the best we have had in many years and will lead to improved learning for students.

We know that there will be some safety regulations placed on schools around the transmission of COVID-19. My team has been actively planning for all possible social distancing outcomes and has multiple phases of planning to ensure that students can be in the building in front of teachers and learning with the least amount of safety restrictions placed upon them. This is an ever-changing situation and the safety protocols that we have in place today will change many times before August. We have already opened up the Preschool for parents and those regulations changed within the first week of opening. My team is doing everything possible to ensure that school looks as normal as possible for students and parents next year, and that we have as many options for school as possible for our parents.

Finally, we know that any learning students can do over the summer will help them as they return to the classroom next year. In this newsletter, you will see resources for reading, Lexia and ST Math. If you can see to it that your student accesses these materials as often as possible this summer, they will be in a better place to start in August.

I want to thank you all again for how we as a community have handled this topsyturvey school year. Our teachers did a great job. Our students did a great job. Our parents did a great job. It is my pleasure to partner with such an amazing group of people. Please have a safe summer and we will see each other again in carpool in August.

If you or anyone you know is interested in enrolling any new students here at RMCA, please fill out the Letter of Intent to Enroll form. You can find the form on our website under enrollment. The form should be fillable from your computer and the completed form can be sent to <a href="Lhuitt@rmcacs.org">Lhuitt@rmcacs.org</a>, faxed to 719 -622-8004, or dropped off in our front office Monday-Friday from 9 AM to 2 PM.

Once received, we will send a confirmation email and let you know if we have an immediate spot available in the grade(s) you are interested in. If a spot is immediately available, we will send over an enrollment offer through email. If a spot is not immediately available, we will place your student on our waitlist and offer spots on a first come first serve basis. Staff member children, students with siblings who currently attend, and students transferring from the homeschool will receive priority placement.




We have seen tremendous growth in our students this year in partnership with Lexia's reading program.

Our students working in above grade level material has grown from just 3% all the way up to 58% of our students! That is outstanding!

We have also moved our students working in below grade level material from 69% of our students down to 13%! Great job KNIGHTS!

Don't forget that over the summer, we can continue to grow by logging on 30 minutes each week day on Lexia.



### Plan Your Move to Core5 Browser or Mobile Version—Now

The desktop-installed version of Lexia Core5 Reading will be discontinued after June 30, 2020. This is the version that users download from <a href="www.lexialearning.com">www.lexialearning.com</a>, and install and run locally on their machines.

You will need to move anyone still using the desktop-installed version of Core5 to an alternate version (browser or mobile app).

How to know if you are using the desktop-installed version:

- 1. On your computer, open Core5.
- **2.** At the login screen, click on the gear in the lower right corner.
- **3.** Look at the top blue bar. If you see "Version 2.8.147 (v2.8)" or a version number LOWER than 2.8.147, you are using the desktop installed version and should move to the browser-based version.

How to access the browser-based version of Core5:

- 1. Download a supported web browser -- Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge
- 2. Open the browser and navigate to www.lexiacore5.com/register
- **3.** Enter the teacher email to set up the device
- 4. Log in with the same username and password used on the desktop installed version

I encourage you all to do something fun, something you've never done before, and then go tell someone about it. Know that we love you all and we look forward to the day when we can see each other face to face again.



# Summer Adventure Presented by Children's Hospital of Colorado






